Herein please find the 42nd Annual Report from NAACLS which includes several important components. First of all are the numbers of NAACLS-accredited and approved programs. Accredited and approved programs remain strong with new programs starting while a few programs are closing. Looking at the list of accredited programs it should be highlighted that the first Doctorate in Clinical Laboratory Science (DCLS) program was granted Initial Accreditation! This is probably the biggest news of the past year! Congratulations to the University of Texas Medical Branch for this historic achievement and we look forward to more programs joining them!

With regards to NAACLS "Approved" programs, the approved programs, phlebotomy and clinical assistant, will be changed to "Accredited" programs over the next two years. The use of the "Approved" status has been confusing especially to the agency that recognizes NAACLS, the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA), and so it was decided to change our procedures and only "accredit" programs.

Next is a long list of our volunteers. Thank you so much to all of the people who volunteer their time to make a robust process of true peer-review occur for all of our programs. Their dedication is especially appreciated over the last year when plans changed quickly and programs were site-visited either in person or virtually. Your flexibility and commitment to assessing program compliance with NAACLS standards in chaotic times is not taken for granted. Thank you! New volunteers are always needed and welcome. NAACLS is in strong financial shape as you will see in the Statements of Financial Position. Our investments are strong, and we have been keeping expenses down as much as possible.

The last few pages list the names and contact information of the members of the Board of Directors, Review Committee for Accredited Programs, Programs Approval Review Committee, Doctoral Review Committee and the NAACLS Staff. Each person on these rosters fulfills a critical role in the operations of NAACLS, and the organization is strong because of their efforts.

The Board of Directors recently adopted a new strategic plan which will drive NAACLS efforts over the next few years. These are the targets of the plan and each target includes several goals: 1) Promote program excellence and innovation; 2) Promote and market the value of NAACLS accreditation/approval; 3) Maintain and improve quality accreditation services; 4) Support and enhance the professional development of staff, volunteers, and program personnel, and 5) Maintain stable financial position to support NAACLS' mission. We look forward to reporting on the progress of these initiatives over the next year and longer.

A Search Committee is currently actively looking for the next CEO of NAACLS. Dr. Dianne Cearlock has led NAACLS over the last 16 years. It is expected that the new CEO will start later this summer so that Dr. Cearlock can mentor the incoming CEO before her last official day at the end of August. Thank you to Dr. Cearlock for 16 years of strong leadership and vision keeping NAACLS current and viable in times of great change.

One of Dr. Cearlock's last projects has been to start a "Future and Emerging Professions Task Force" whose purpose it is to expand the types of educational programs that may be granted accreditation through NAACLS. The first such program that has been suggested is a program that prepares people to take the categorical in Microbiology certification exam. Hassan Aziz serves on the Task Force with Karen Brown, Peter Hu, and Dianne Cearlock. The task force established a workgroup to help advance their charge. Elizabeth Gockel-Blessing, Carol Rentas, MaryEllen Tancred, Janna Schill, Michelle Hill, and Janice Conway-Klaassen serve on the workgroup.

Last, but not least, NAACLS is up for Recognition by CHEA this year and, thus, Dr. Cearlock and the NAACLS staff will be preparing a self-study documenting how NAACLS complies with the CHEA standards. What the report will demonstrate and what I want you to know is that the state of NAACLS is strong and it is because of its leadership, staff and volunteers!


